ERIKA DYCK is an associate professor and Tier 2 Canada Research Chair in History of Medicine at the University of Saskatchewan. In 2008 she published a monograph called *Psychedelic Psychiatry: LSD from Clinic to Campus* with Johns Hopkins University Press. Erika is currently engaged in two major projects related to the history of mental health and psychiatry in western Canada. In addition to her work as co-principal investigator for the Open Doors project, she has a SSHRC funded project, which she hopes will culminate in a monograph called "Eugenic Frontiers," which compares popular and political attitudes towards eugenic sterilization in Alberta and Saskatchewan from 1920 to 1975. In the Open Doors project, Erika is looking at debates within the psychiatry profession concerning deinstitutionalization and the role that psychopharmacological drugs and medical research played in discussions surrounding the closure of long-stay hospitals
