

KATHRYN MCKAY is currently a PhD candidate in History at Simon Fraser University. Her dissertation compares the level and type of treatment given to status and non-status First Nations patients diagnosed with schizophrenia in British Columbia during the first half of the twentieth century. She maintains that treatment for this diagnosis was unevenly applied depending on the patient's ethnic and legal status. Kathryn McKay's work in the Open Doors project explores the experience of de-institutionalization among First Nations patients. She is specifically interested in the inter-play between Indian Agents and medical authorities in relation to the discharge of status Indians and patients of First Nations descent.
