ROBERT MENZIES is a Professor of Sociology at Simon Fraser University. He has been studying the history of madness and psychiatry in British Columbia since the early 1990s. Bob's current projects include an institutional history of the Provincial Mental Home, Colquitz; an inquiry into the intersection between race, ethnicity and psychiatry in the BC mental health system; and an account of the eugenics movement in early twentieth-century Canada, with particular focus on sexual sterilization law and practice in Canada's westernmost province. Bob has two projects which relate to Open Doors. He has been chronicling the January 1964 closure of the Provincial Mental Home, Colquitz, British Columbia, with particular focus on the institutional and community experiences of male 'criminally insane' inmates who left Colquitz during the final years of its operation. He is in the early stages of a project on CCF stalwart and social activist Ernest Winch's involvements in the community support of discharged patients from Riverview Hospital in Coquitlam, with particular focus on the 1943 founding of the New Vista Society.
